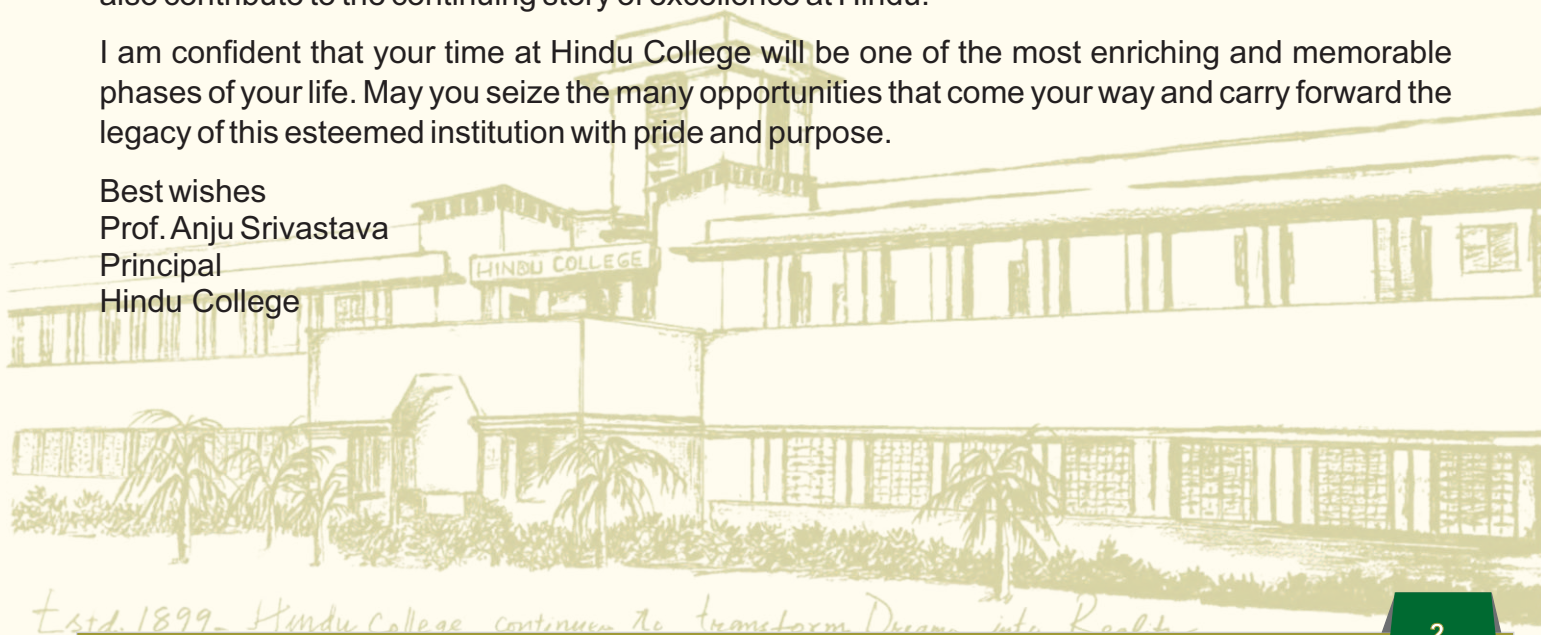

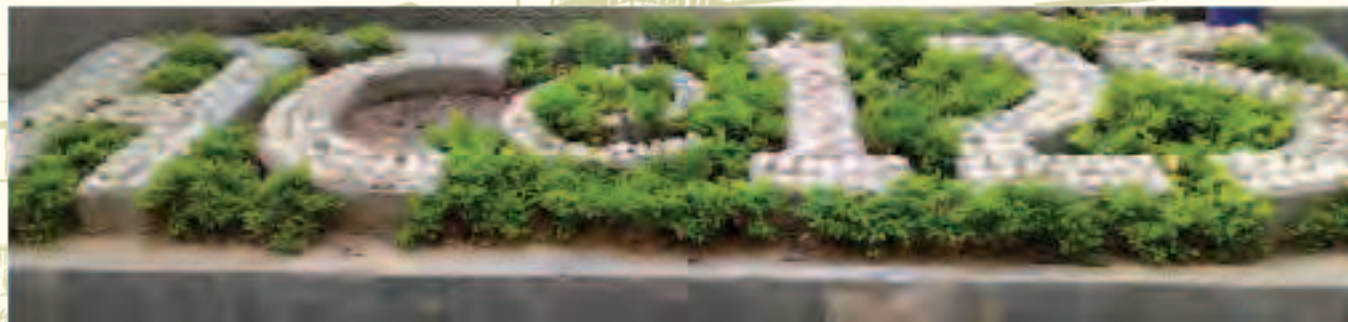


COLLEGE PROFILE

Hindu College is recognized as one of the premier academic institutions in the country. It stands tall in public esteem and also in the memories of its alumni, many of whom are prominent figures in government, business and industry, the media and education. Students from all over India and abroad have been educated here and excelled in the chosen areas of their interest, be it academics, sports, or extracurricular activities.

The College was founded more than a century ago in 1899, by Late Shri Kishan Dass ji Gurwale. In the backdrop of the nationalist struggle against British rule, some prominent philanthropist citizens including Gurwale ji of Delhi, decided to start an educational institution that would provide nationalist, non-elitist, and non-sectarian education to the youth. Originally, the College was housed in a humble building in Kinari Bazar, Chandni Chowk, and was affiliated to Punjab University as there was no Delhi University at that time. As the college grew, it faced a major crisis in 1902 due to inadequate infrastructure. But fortunately at this point, Rai Bahadur Sultan Singh generously donated a part of his historic property, (which originally belonged to Col. Skinner) located at Kashmere Gate, to the College, thereby enabling it to function there till 1953, following which, it moved to its present location in Delhi University.

In 2024, Hindu College completed 125 glorious years of its existence. This monumental event was marked by a year-long celebration of its rich history and legacy. The Quasquicentennial celebrations consisted of a sparkling chain of academic and cultural events commemorating the remarkable journey of the institution. The foundation stone of the new boy's hostel was laid during this time. Soon after the celebrations, a two-storied state-of-the-art Sanganeria Faculty Block was inaugurated.



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Hindu College was a centre for intellectual and political debate during India's freedom struggle, especially during the Quit India Movement. This is the only College in Delhi to have a Students' Parliament since 1935, which in fact, provided a platform to many national leaders including Mahatma Gandhi, Pt. Moti Lal Nehru, Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru, Sarojini Naidu, Annie Besant, Mohammad Ali Jinnah, and Subhash Chandra Bose for motivating the youth. Responding wholeheartedly to Gandhiji's Quit India call in 1942, the college played a leading role in India's freedom struggle as some teachers and students of the College even went to prison.



The College has seen remarkable growth over the years. It is not only one of the most distinguished undergraduate and postgraduate co-educational institutions in the country today, but is also, by many accounts, the college of first choice in Delhi. It boasts of an accomplished faculty of about 150 members, and about 3800 students. The College is also proud of its efficient and very supportive administrative/non-teaching staff. It offers a number of courses in the Science, Humanities and the Social Science Streams.

The College Library has a rich collection of books and journals. The Library Block was renovated recently and now includes the newly inaugurated S.N.P. Punj Memorial Knowledge Centre for E-learning. The knowledge centre marks a significant step in empowering learners and educators with modern tools and resources, and advancing education through technology and innovation.



The college also has well-equipped, state-of-the-art laboratories, one each for Physics, Chemistry, Botany, and Zoology, in both the Old Building and the Sanganeria Science Block. The college also saw a grand

opening of two new laboratories in the New Academic Block in the previous academic year – the Public policy Lab and the Olfactory Studio/ Perfumery Lab, thus signifying a move towards and willingness to charter unconventional academic paths.

The co-curricular facilities on campus include an Amphitheatre and one of the finest Auditoria in Delhi. The Auditorium is fully air-conditioned, with excellent acoustics and interiors, comfortable seating, and excellent green rooms and a grand stage, comparable to any modern movie theatre. The Amphitheatre, which has been named Utsav, reflects the spirit of celebration, provides our students with yet another space for self-expression for their creative potential. The college also has a Students' Centre that offers the facilities of a seminar room (now Shyam Kasturi Seminar Hall), bank, computer room, stationery shop, a photocopier, along with the NSS, NCC, and Counselling office rooms. The college campus is well known for its well-maintained gardens and lovely trees, a vast sports ground, and a men's hostel (under construction) as well as a girls' hostel which can accommodate nearly 200 students. Spread over twenty-five acres of land, the College premises are housed in one of the prime locations of the North Campus of the University of Delhi, well connected by road and the Delhi Metro.



The College provides a liberal, lively and competitive environment enabling students to carve out a niche for themselves in their chosen arenas. The quality and calibre of our students is also reflected in the large number of scholarship holders in the college. One of the most prestigious scholarships awarded by the college is the Raj Bhargava Foundation Scholarship that follows a unique, multi-stage evaluation process to select meritorious students in social sciences. There are also scholarships for students in need of financial assistance.

DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

Established in 1972, the Department of Botany has evolved into a center of academic excellence and research. With a committed and highly qualified faculty, the Department has consistently maintained high standards in both teaching and research. Faculty members not only impart quality education, but also are actively engaged in research across diverse fields such as Reproductive Biology, Phycology, Bryology, Applied Microbiology, Molecular Biology, Cellular and Molecular Cytogenetics, Biotechnology, Bio-informatics, Biochemistry and Biophysics.



The faculty has published several research papers in journals of national and international repute. They have also contributed significantly to academic literature through authoring and editing books and course materials for institutions such as CBSE, NCERT and IGNOU. Several faculty-led research projects have been supported by esteemed funding agencies like UGC, DST and University of Delhi, leading to improved infrastructural facilities that directly benefit students.

The Department is actively engaged in initiatives under the DBT Star College Scheme, further enriching the academic ecosystem. The scheme has facilitated the upgradation of laboratory infrastructure, encouraged inter-disciplinary learning, and enhanced exposure of students to advanced scientific techniques. Regular workshops, hands-on training sessions, and faculty training programs are organized under its ambit to foster a culture of research and innovation. At present, the Department hosts and mentors IIT scholars, recipients of the Prime Minister's Research Fellowship (PMRF), who collaborate with faculty and provide hands-on training to under-graduate students, particularly in the field of Microbiology. The non-teaching staff is helpful, cooperative and dedicated, and plays a vital role in ensuring the smooth functioning of the Department.

The students seeking admission to B.Sc. (Hons.) course in Botany come from diverse backgrounds from various places within and outside India. The Department provides them a





comfortable environment for their learning and overall grooming for future careers. Students of the Department are actively involved in research at the under-graduate level under various Innovation Research Projects sponsored by the University of Delhi. They also participate in Summer Internship Programs in renowned labs such as National Institute of Immunology, Delhi, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore and Delhi Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Research (DIPSAR), New Delhi. The Alumni of the Department have excelled in various fields, be it administrative/civil services, academics, research, armed forces, print/news media, airline-aviation

etc. and have kept the flag flying high for the Department and the college.

The Department has a Botanical Society-'Sanjeevani' which organizes lectures by eminent botanists to keep the students abreast with the latest developments in the field of plant sciences. The endeavor is to inculcate interest, curiosity and broaden their minds for a better understanding of the subject at the under-graduate level, prepare them for higher learning in specialized areas and provide an insight into the future career options. The society organizes visits to Research Institutes to provide theoretical knowledge as well as hands-on training to the students in the research labs. The society also organizes field excursions to educate students about the natural habitats of diverse plant groups. Besides educating the students about various plants, this also provides an opportunity for better interaction among students and the faculty members, thereby creating a conducive environment for a more effective teaching-learning process. During the annual festival '*Inflorescence*', various inter- and intra-college events are organized to widen the horizons of their knowledge and also encourage them to improve their creative talent and skills.

In the last few years, significant infrastructural upliftment has occurred in the college in general and across all the Science Departments in particular. The Department of Botany has one more laboratory (Lab No. 302) in the new academic block that accommodates about 40 students. Besides, each laboratory (three in total) has a camera fitted microscope that not only enables



students have a peep into the bewildering microscopic organization of the cells, it also allows them to measure the dimensions of various cellular inclusions, making the learning process more enjoyable. All laboratories have ICT facilities. The Department also has a Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF) having equipment useful for conducting curriculum-based experiments and the research work. The Department has a Botanical Garden that has an artificial pond and a collection of plants for study.

Recently, the Department also established a Mushroom Skill Development Centre catering to the needs of students opting for Mushroom Cultivation as Skill Enhancement Course. The Department is also working on the development of Plant Tissue Culture Skill Development Centre under the Delhi University Skill Development initiative.

The Department strives to provide the best to its students.

DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY



One of the most distinguished Departments across the University, the Department of Chemistry has always striven for excellence in terms of teaching learning pedagogy. Whether it is theory or practice, the main aim of pedagogy here is to build on learning and work on development of skills and attitudes of the learners. The growing stature of the Department is quite evidently magnified by the meritorious students who emerge as university toppers, being able to acquire admission in some of the best post-graduate, research based Science and Engineering courses in India and abroad.



To name a few, mention should be made of institutions like TIFR, IISc, IITs, TERI etc. all under the able guidance of the strong team of devoted teaching faculty. The department provides an excellent platform for research for wildly research enthusiastic undergraduate, graduate, post graduate students by conducting Add-on courses, Internships, research projects and even Ph.D guidance. Through the internship programmes and projects offered by the department, the young students get an in house opportunity for building an early and strong foundation towards pursuance of research.

Faculty Members:

The Department is well known for its eminent teaching faculty who are not just established educators, but also excellent researchers and the large contributors in the evolution of the Department leading it to attain greater height. It has the distinction of having strong team of eighteen academicians who in addition to being involved in regular classroom teaching, are actively involved beyond classrooms in executing expertise in the field of



various research areas by working on projects funded by prestigious government agencies such as DST, DBT etc., conducting value added courses for various students of the department and outside college, publishing books, guiding PhD students and interns.

Courses Offered:

The Department offers B.Sc (Hons). Chemistry as the major component along with B.Sc Physical science (Chemistry) which is an amalgamation of Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics. In addition to these courses, the department has the responsibility of teaching generic elective (GE) papers and Value added courses (VAC) to students of other departments. These courses provide an extensive theoretical background with a balanced practical component.



Infrastructure/Facilities:

The chemistry lectures are generally taught in technologically enhanced classrooms with projectors and laptop connectors. The exceptional teaching environment is supplemented further by the rich infrastructure offered by the department which boasts of its three well-equipped laboratories besides an instrumentation laboratory that houses modern instruments, such as U.V.-Visible Spectrophotometer, Flame Photometers, Potentiometers, pH meters and colorimeters etc. and well trained, devoted laboratory staff. With the department being awarded the prestigious DBT Star College Project Grant along with the other science departments of the college, the facilities are expanding incessantly and under the aegis of this star scheme, the department has witnessed an exceptional advancement with quality workshops, lecture series, training programmes and outreach programmes being organized with support of the non-teaching staff.



Chemical Societies - Tatva and Turiss

The Department also boasts of vibrant co-scholastic societies, 'TATVA' and 'TURISS' where the students and teachers interact beyond classroom and course curricula, to express themselves freely. The societies organise seminars, workshops and popular lectures on regular basis to enrich and update its members with the latest developments across the globe. One of the most attractive events organized by the societies are the Inter-College festival 'CATALYSIS' and 'URJOTSAV' which also witnesses the release of the annual magazines 'SUBSTANCE' and 'ESSENCE'. With a clan of





devoted educators and spirited students, the societies have always attempted to live up to its motto "The Bond of Togetherness."

A host of activities are organized by the department and chemistry societies to keep the faculty and students abreast with the latest research developments in the field of chemistry and related interdisciplinary sciences.

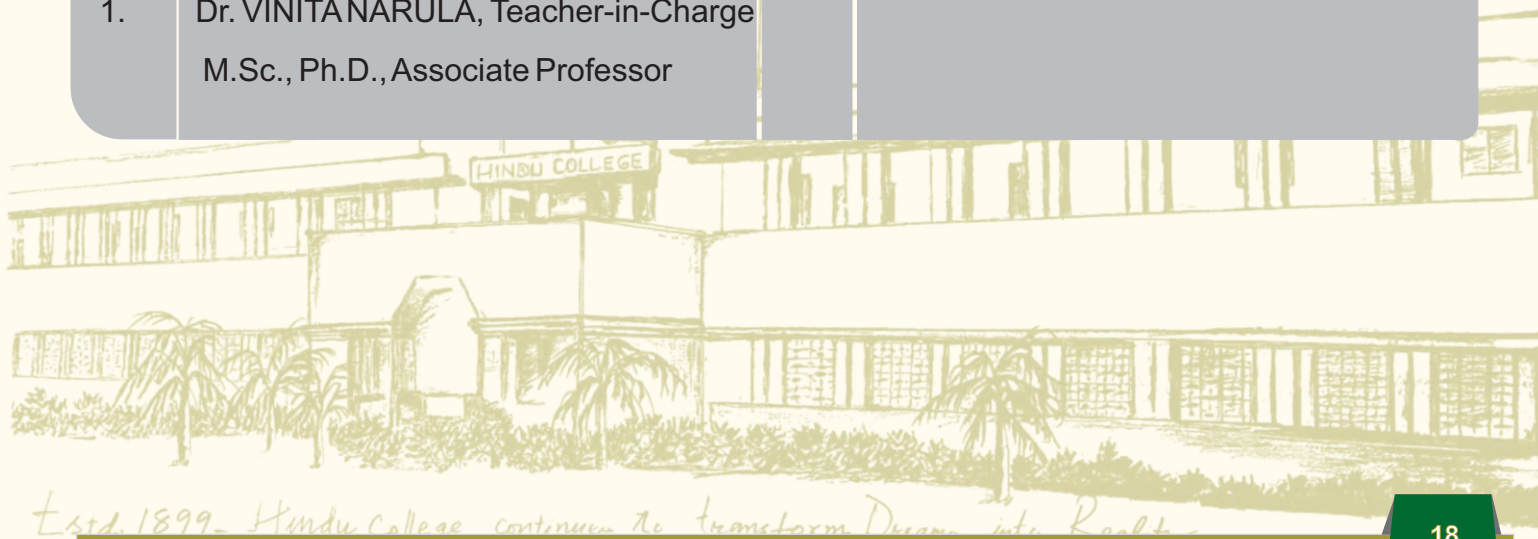
DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL SCIENCE WITH CHEMISTRY

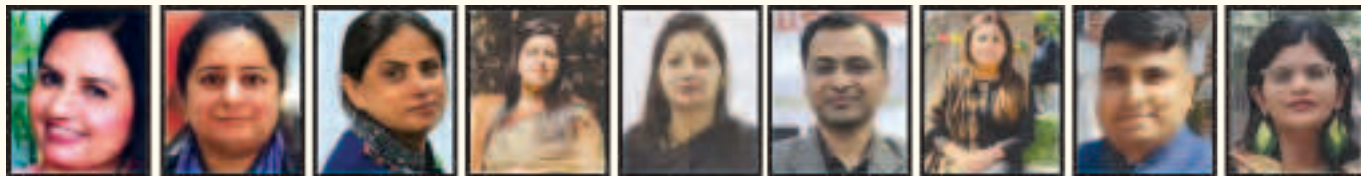

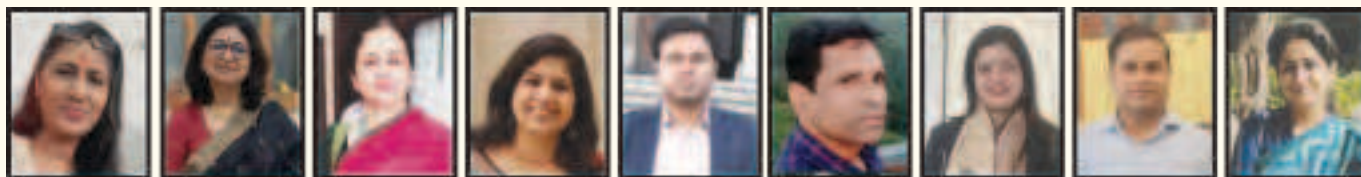

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DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

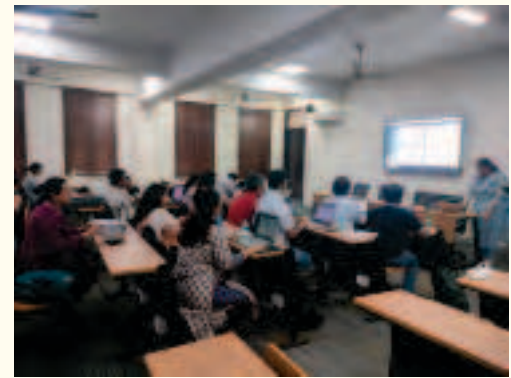


The Economics Department is one of the constituent departments of Hindu College and among the best departments in India for undergraduate study of Economics. It has a dedicated and experienced faculty of nine members with diverse specializations and/or interests. In keeping with the spirit of UGCF-NEP, the department offers its students a choice from among a wide range of Discipline Specific Electives such as Applied Econometrics, Comparative Economic Development, Environmental Economics, Game Theory, International Trade, Money & Financial Markets, Political Economy, Open Economy Macroeconomics and Public Economics. The Department extends its multi-disciplinary approach with Value Added Courses (VAC): Financial Literacy and Digital Empowerment. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): Advanced Spreadsheet Tools, Sustainable Ecotourism and Business Communication are also offered by the Department.

The pedagogy combines standard methods of university education – lectures and tutorials with written assignments, project work, training in statistical and mathematical software, field trips, and student presentations both in class and in seminars. Students are also encouraged to participate in the corporate and research life of institutions outside college through internships. The department has an active and vibrant Economics Society that organizes a variety of events to promote students' interest in the subject. The big event of the year is the Economics Festival 'L'Economiste' that bears witness to participation from colleges all across the country. With students taking part in policy making 'battles', discussing matters such as the nexus between economics (& finance) and cyber-terrorism as part of a Joint Crisis Committee, or participating in the IPL Auction event 'Wits and Wickets'. L'Economiste offers a unique academic experience while also getting students to engage in contemporary, real-world issues relating to Economics. Distinguished speakers from the field are also invited to share their expertise from their respective areas of research.

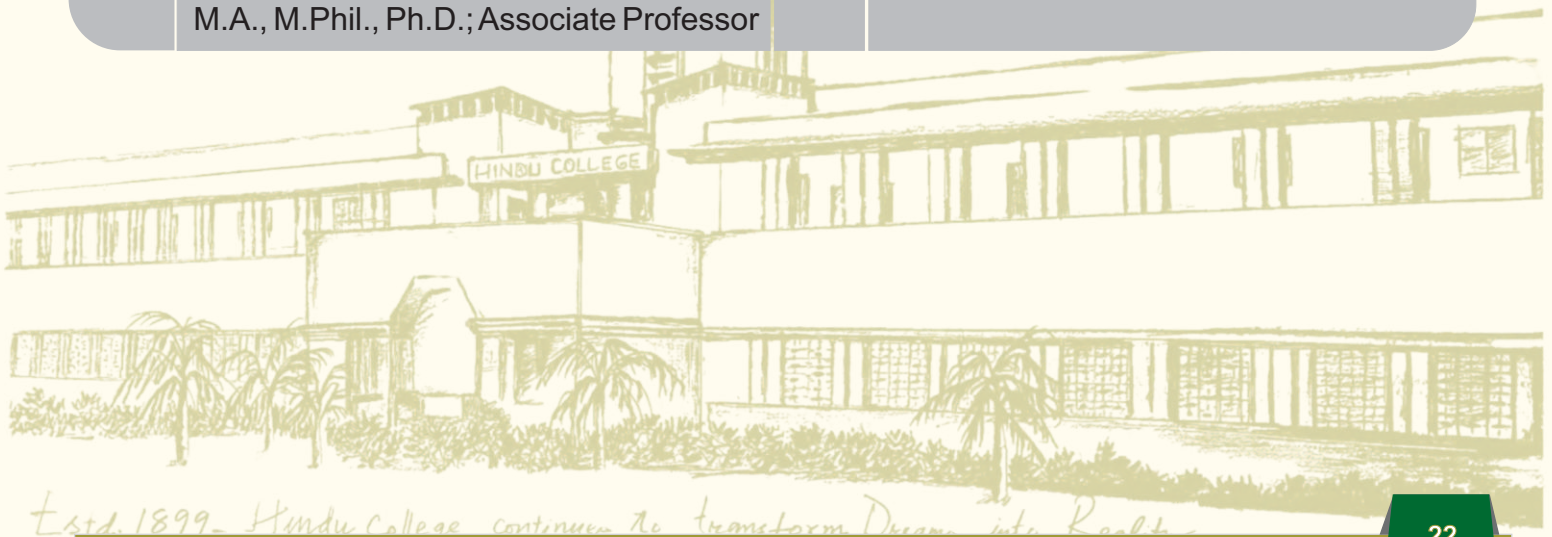

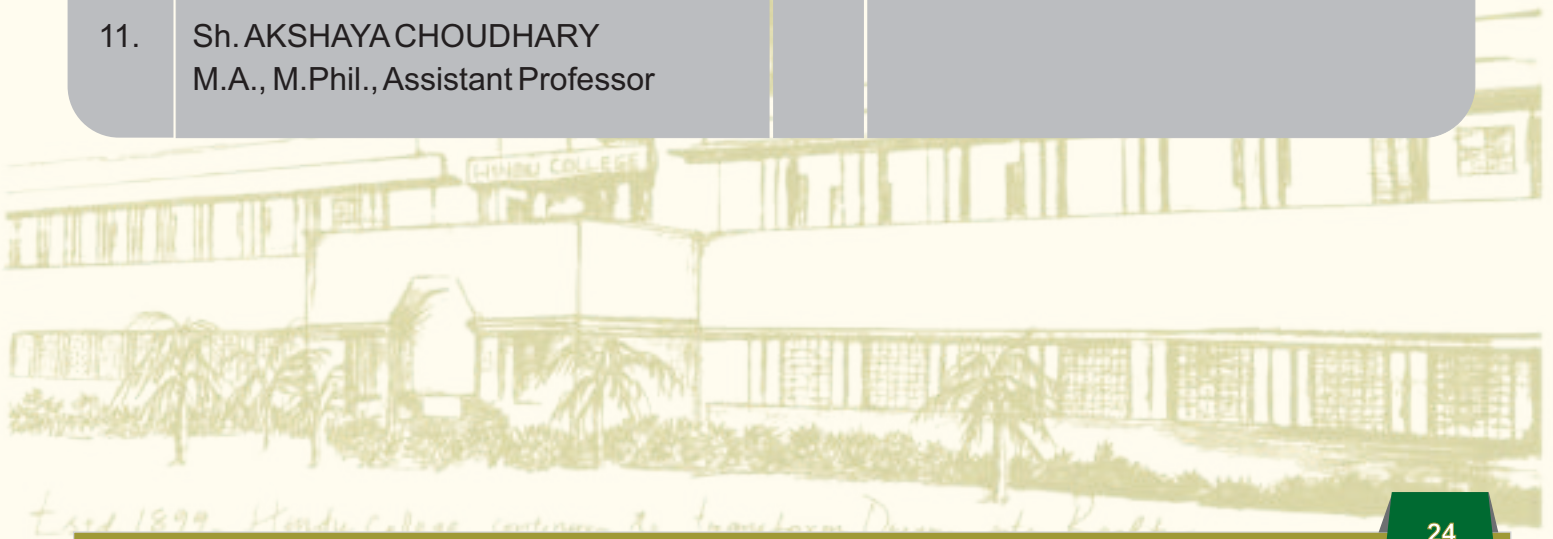




Department organizes a variety of scholarly events, including lectures, workshops, and conferences, providing students with numerous opportunities for intellectual enrichment.

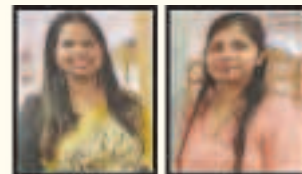

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT SCIENCE

The Department of Environmental Science is the youngest department of the college and known for a long-term vision of different disciplines of Environmental Science like earth processes, atmospheric processes, mechanisms, impacts and mitigation, environmental pollution, ecological processes, and their role in environmental systems, biodiversity and conservation, environmental policies, laws and governance and environmental sustainability. It offers an interdisciplinary program that reflects the multi-disciplinary nature of the environment and its contribution in making the earth, safe and healthy. The department maintains a strong academic orientation by valuing the student-teacher relationship mantra by facilitating students to pursue their long-term career in different areas of Environmental Science. Currently, we offer a range of programs at the undergraduate level that are designed to meet the diverse interests and career goals of our students. It is provided under NEP: UGCF 2022 as an Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) 1 and 2, respectively, for the first two years. Our department also serves as a platform to conduct practical, field work, projects for the post-graduate students from IGNOU.



Several student internships are conducted in national and international collaborations in different fields of atmospheric sciences, environmental sustainability, climate change and biodiversity and policy based issues. Students are also involved in Innovative Research projects funded by local and national agencies and actively involved in conducting as well as participating in conferences, seminars, workshops in various areas of Environment. The Department achieved several milestones through innovative training programs, international courses, and research collaborations. It organized International Training on Climate Change Mitigation Using MyTree Model supported by the United States Forest Service (USFS); an add-on course titled Climate Action and Synergies: United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals and Workshop on Understanding Atmospheric Thermodynamics, Weather and Climate in collaboration with IIT Delhi under the PMRF scheme; iLEAPS-Hindu College International Course on Atmospheric Sciences and Climate Change in collaboration with global experts supported by UKCEH and Future Earth and co-hosted a side meeting at COP16 in Riyadh on governance strategies to address desertification, reinforcing its contribution to global sustainability efforts. The Department is also running an international research project i-TREE Eco Model funded by USFS focuses on assessing urban green spaces in Delhi NCR as sustainable solutions for climate change and air pollution mitigation and 7 undergraduate students are working as paid project interns. These initiatives underscore the Department's commitment to interdisciplinary education, impactful research, and international collaboration, solidifying its leadership in environmental science and sustainability. 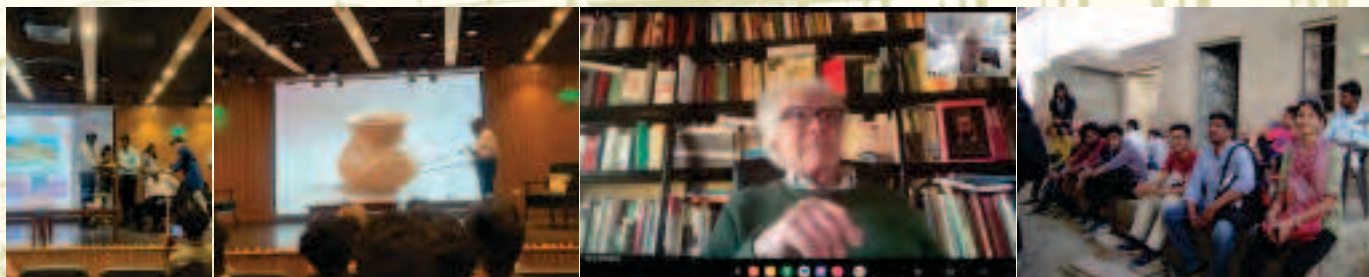

DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

The Department of Philosophy comprises a committed faculty with specialization in diverse areas such as Indian Philosophy, Greek Philosophy, Continental Thought, Logic, Ethics, Aesthetics, Philosophy of Mind, Philosophy of Science and Philosophy of Religion. Centered Courses for the Honours students from other Departments, and conducted tutorials for Postgraduate students. Since July 2007, the Department has launched an Honours programme for Undergraduate students. Hindu College is one of the earliest co-educational institutions in the University of Delhi to offer an Honours Course in Philosophy. Under the UGCF-NEP, the Department offers Core Courses (CC), Discipline Specific Electives (DSE), Value Addition Courses (VAC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) over eight semesters for a degree in BA (H) Philosophy. The Department also offers a range of Generic Electives (GE) to students of other departments. Our students have brought us laurels, each year we have been getting the top ranks in the University. In addition to the scheduled lectures and tutorials, the Department also holds periodic lectures by renowned scholars, seminars, group discussions, debates and workshops with the aim of augmenting the integral intellectual development of the students. DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE

The Department holds the distinction of admitting students at 100% for general category during the academic session 2021-22. It was the highest percentage for admission in any subject in the entire University and even with this percentage required for admission, the Department had to admit double the number of students of the sanctioned strength.

Political Science as a subject is concerned with the day-to-day affairs of individuals and society. It encompasses normative inquiry into larger questions as the best form of political order, the optimum relationship between the individual and government and the nature of the public good. It is the study of people's perceptions of their own and of other societies and their place therein. It thus naturally involves looking into the myriad ways in which people seek to govern themselves and make decisions to manage and solve their common and collective issues. The focus is on the ways in which political power is distributed, operated and managed. In so doing, the subject dwells on moral ideals, ethical issues, political events, actions and institutions. It includes both understanding and explaining the world of politics that is all around us. The faculty consists of young and enthusiastic teachers committed to creating a democratic academic culture. At present, it has eight teachers.



The department offers a wide choice of optional courses including 'Public Policy in India', 'Understanding South Asia', 'Feminism: Theory and Practices', 'Contemporary Political Economy',



'Feminism and Indian Politics', 'The United Nations and Global Conflicts', etc. The department has been very active in organizing seminars and symposia on issues of diverse interests. The participation of the faculty and the students on a regular basis in debates and discussions makes the department dynamic and vibrant.



The department offers BA (Honours) and MA courses at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels respectively. At the undergraduate level, the department also offers core and discipline-based papers as part of the BA programme curriculum. Within the framework of UGCF-NEP instead of LOCF at the undergraduate levels, in particular, it offers various skill based interdisciplinary and generic courses. POLSO, the Political Science society



comprises of all the students of the department. It has a democratic tradition of electing its own representatives who, in consultation with and under the guidance of faculty members, conduct the academic and cultural activities. The Society organizes its annual festival POLITY, where issues of varied interests are debated and discussed with renowned panellists, with a wide range of interests and specializations. 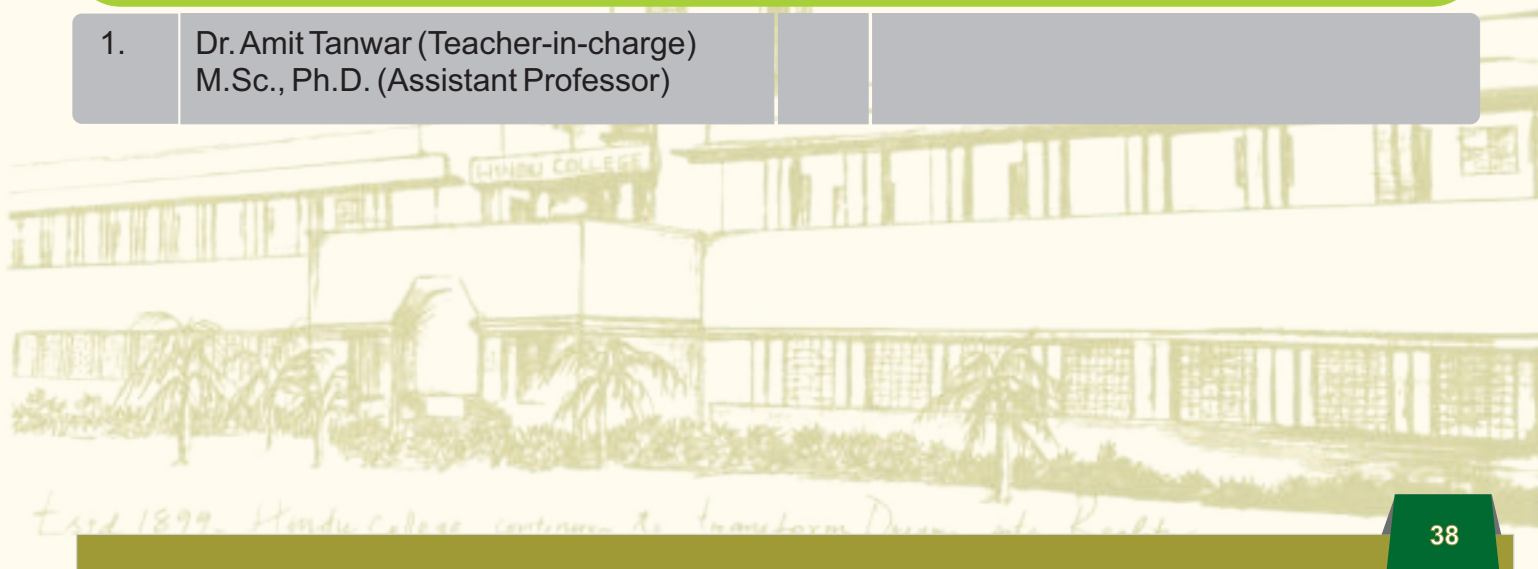

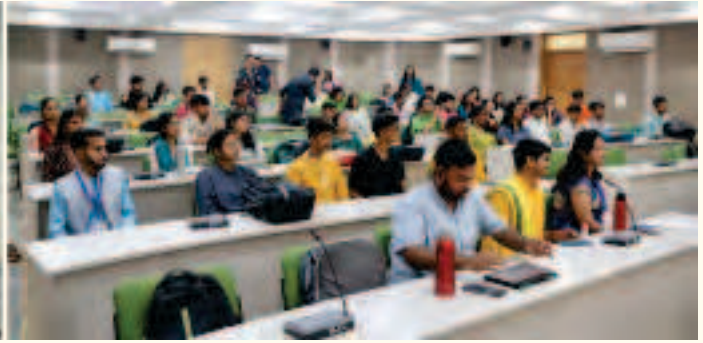


DEPARTMENT OF SANSKRIT

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

Established in 1969, the department of Sociology has a robust record of academic achievements and creative excellence. Our students consistently perform well in university examinations often securing top positions. Under the UGCF-NEP, the department offers Core Courses (CC), Discipline Specific Electives (DSE), Value Addition Courses (VAC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) over eight semesters for a degree in BA (H) Sociology. The CC impart fundamentals of the discipline in the first two semesters; in the third and the fourth semesters, students are imparted knowledge of several substantive areas of Sociology, such as religion, politics, economy, and family and kinship as well as applied skill based elective courses. The fifth and sixth semesters impart knowledge of specialized areas of research through variety of DSE, with students given an option to choose a preferred DSE, along with compulsory courses which give grounding in theoretical and methodological orientations of the discipline. The final year is devoted to nurturing research aptitude and skills amongst students under the guidance of department faculty. The courses are taught through well designed curricula comprising original texts and standard works by eminent sociologists. Pedagogically, the department places emphasis on interactive learning where students are encouraged to engage in meaningful dialogue with both peers and faculty. The department further offers a range of Generic Elective (GE) to students from other departments. The department has an accomplished faculty with considerable expertise in a wide range of subjects including economic and political sociology, kinship, religion, gender, education, medicine and health and sociological theories and research. Specialists in the discipline are invited periodically to deliver lectures on a chosen theme to further invigorate the academic environment.

The department has an energetic sociological society called 'Verband' with elected student office bearers. In active collaboration with the faculty, the society organizes academic seminars, lectures, and workshops during an academic year. Our annual department festival RITES is the highlight of the society's calendar; it is an inter-college event having both an academic and





extracurricular component. The department also boasts of having an Ethnographic Film Club, OEUVRE, which holds screenings and discussions of ethnographic films around the world. The department brings out an annual magazine, WAQIF, of which the students constitute the editorial team. Our students participate actively in various co-curricular societies of the college often assuming crucial leadership roles in them. Through rigorous

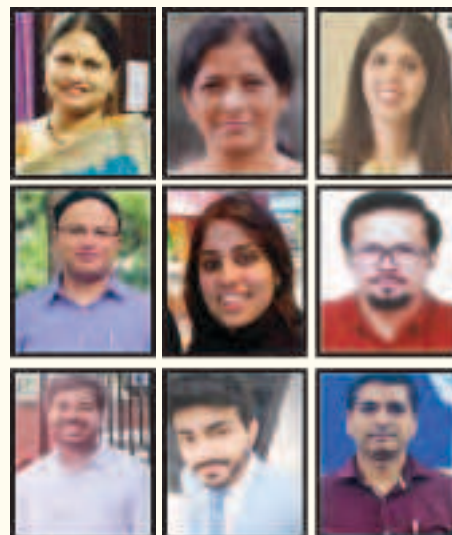

- For seat allocations and admissions, candidates must apply to the Common Seat Allocation System (CSAS(UG)-2025) of University of Delhi. Details related to allocations and admissions through CSAS(UG)-2025 etc. will be notified separately. Candidate must visit www.admission.uod.ac.in on regular basis.

Please read the following in reference to admissions to Hindu College.

1. Admissions to all Undergraduate Programs at the University of Delhi will be based on the scores obtained in CUET (UG) - 2025, except for admissions to the School of Open Learning (SOL), Non-Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB) and for Foreign Nationals.
2. An eligible candidate desirous of seeking admission to the Undergraduate Program(s) of the University of Delhi for the academic session 2025-26 must read the contents of this Bulletin of Information (BOI) 2025-26, as well as the notifications, updates and information published on the website of the University of Delhi (www.admission.uod.ac.in) very carefully.
3. The candidate must have studied and passed Class XII examination or its equivalent from a single recognized board.
4. The candidate must have studied and passed Class XII examination of any Board / University in India, or any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
5. For admission to University of Delhi, it is mandatory for the candidate to appear in CUET (UG) - 2025 in those subjects in which s(he) is appearing/has passed Class XII.
6. In case the subject studied at Class XII is not mentioned in the CUET (UG) - 2025, the candidate must appear in the Language/Domain Specific subject that is similar/closely related to the subject s(he) has studied at Class XII (for example, if a candidate has studied Biochemistry in Class XII, s(he) must appear in Biology in CUET (UG) - 2025). For establishing similarity of CUET (UG) subjects with subjects taken in Class XII, at least 50% of the syllabus of should match. The University reserves the right for establishing the similarity. The decision of university in this regard shall be final and binding.
7. Allocation and admission will be based only on the combination of Language/s, Domain Specific Subjects and/or General Aptitude Test (GAT) in which a candidate has appeared in CUET (UG) – 2025 as per the respective Program-Specific Eligibility. For list of CUET papers and syllabus, refer to website of NTA (<https://cuet.nta.nic.in>).
8. The candidate is advised to check that s(he) satisfies all eligibility criteria for the Program(s) for which s(he) is appearing in CUET (UG) - 2025. Admission is subject to the candidate's fulfilling the eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned program of study. In case a candidate does not meet any of the eligibility criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned program and appears in the entrance test, it is at the candidate's own risk and cost. If at any stage, it is found that eligibility requirement/s is/are not fulfilled, the admission, if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto.
9. Only the scores obtained in CUET (UG) - 2025 will be considered for admissions to the academic year 2025-26.
10. The candidate must read the Program-Specific requirements carefully and then appear in Language/s and/ or Domain Specific Subjects of the CUET (UG) - 2025.

11. Candidates desirous of seeking admission to University of Delhi will also have to apply to University of Delhi's Common Seat Allocation System (UG)-2025. The details related to allocations and admissions through CSAS(UG)-2025 etc. will be notified separately on the website of University of Delhi.
12. Grievance related to non-appearance in CUET (UG) - 2025 or the required Language/s, Domain Specific Subjects and/or General Aptitude Test (GAT) will not be entertained.
13. Before registering for CUET (UG) - 2025, the candidate is advised to carefully read the Bulletin of Information (BOI) 2025-26 and consult the University of Delhi Act, 1922 and the Statutes. The Ordinances, Rules and Regulations of the University of Delhi, available on the University website, would be binding on them.
14. Candidates must be careful while filling the CUET (UG)-2025 form as certain fields such as Name, signature and photograph of the candidate will be later auto-integrated by University of Delhi from CUET (UG)-2025. These fields will be non-editable.
15. The name of the candidate claiming reservation must match with the Candidate's name as it appears on his/her corresponding school board qualifying certificates and in CUET (UG)-2025. Similarly, the parents' names must also match in the certificates.
16. As per Ordinance-I of University of Delhi, there is no minimum age bar for admission to the undergraduate programs in the University and its colleges except in the programs where the respective regulatory bodies, such as Medical Council of India (MCI), All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), Bar Council of India (BCI), National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), Dental Council of India (DCI), etc. have prescribed the minimum age requirement in their regulations.
17. Gap year will not be a bar for purpose of admission to undergraduate programs. However, such candidates must also appear in CUET (UG) - 2025 for admissions in academic year 2025-26.
18. Appropriate proration in CUET (UG) - 2025 scores will be done wherever required (including supernumerary quota).
19. As per A.C. Resolution 40 dated 24 / 04 / 1997 of University of Delhi, no student of the University is permitted to pursue two regular degree programs simultaneously either from the University of Delhi or from other university. However, he / she may pursue part-time diplomas / certificates programs offered by the University Departments / Centers / Colleges, if eligible. Candidates must check the website for all updates.

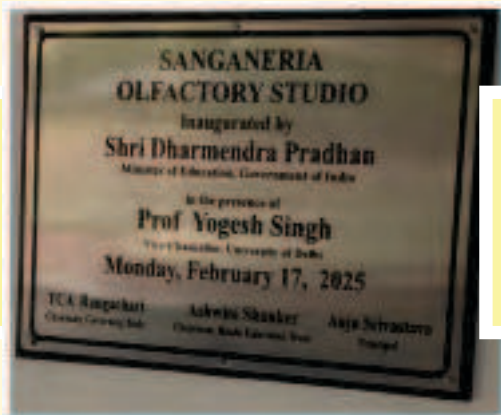

First instituted in 2021-22 Raj Bhargava Foundation Scholarship is aimed at recognising meritorious students in Social Sciences. It is awarded annually to First year students who undergo a multi-stage selection process to qualify and is among the most prestigious scholarship awarded by the college.



THE FOLLOWING SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AWARDED TO THE STUDENTS-

6. **Rajiv Mehra Memorial Scholarship** - Awarded every year to a needy and deserving student who is not a recipient of any Government, University, College Scholarship or any other scholarship, and it is usually tenable for one year.
7. **Dr Deepak Kumar Sinha Memorial Scholarship** -Awarded every year to a student of B.A.(H) Hindi Final year on merit-cum-means basis.
8. **O.P. Kaushik Memorial Scholarship-Awarded** yearly.

FINANCIAL AID

1. Counseling services for physically challenged students.
2. College fee concessions are given to needy and deserving students on the basis of their performance in the examination taken. Students desirous of getting concession should apply to the college office on the prescribed form.

3. **Scholarship for Scheduled Caste/ Tribe Students** - Students belonging to scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and other backward classes, recognized as such by the Government of India, are awarded scholarship by their respective State Governments. Such students are required to apply to State Government concerned on prescribed forms through the Principal immediately after joining the college.



ALL INDIA ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP EXAMINATION

Delhi University holds a competitive examination in Delhi in the month of October each year for the award of the above scholarships, which are 50 in number. Each scholarship is of the value of 250/- per month tenable for the years for pursuing an Honours Degree Course in the University.

The competition is open to students who have passed the S.S. C. Exam (under 10+ 2 pattern Education) from the C.B.S. E., New Delhi, or an examination equivalent there to with 55 % marks in aggregate.

OTHERS DISTINCTIONS/ AWARDS/ HONOURS

Mark of Distinction will be awarded to the outstanding sports students of the year, subject to the attainment of a minimum standard laid down for the purpose.





ATTENDANCE RULES

In order to be eligible to appear at a University Examination every student has to attend a minimum of two third of the total number of lectures delivered at the college in all subjects as also in Tutorials/Preceptorials, as the case may be, taken separately in each Semester. The University Ordinance VII, Clause 2-A, Part (ii) states that the College shall have power to strike off the name of a student who is irregular in attendance or when the absence of the student is for such a long period that he/she cannot put in the requisite percentage of attendance. These rules are strictly followed. Parents/ Guardians are advised to periodically meet teachers of their wards to know the progress of their ward in studies and punctuality in attending classes.

Note: Late admission, if granted, is entirely at the risk of the students concerned and no concession in regard to attendance is allowed. Attendance will be calculated from the date the College re-opens after the summer vacation.

When a student is required to represent the College in competitive events- sports, cultural activities and debates sponsored by the College - he/she must apply for permission in advance, in writing to the Principal.

Exemption from attendance for other reasons may be granted only if permitted by the Principal in writing. Such permission must be obtained well in advance and not at the time of examination.

Application for leave of absence due to sickness/ hospitalisation must be supported by a medical leave and fitness certificate from a recognised medical practitioner, and should reach the Principal within a week of the student re-joining college on the expiry of leave.





INTERNAL AND CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT UNDER UGCF – 2022

As per the Notification dated 10th February 2023 [EC Resolution No. 60-1/(60-1-13) dated 03.02.2023], the following assessment pattern shall be adopted under the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework – 2022, to be implemented from the Academic Year 2022–2023.



Tutorials and Continuous Assessment (CA)

- In any course with 1 credit attributed to 'Tutorial', assessment is mandatory as each earned credit is recorded in the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC).
- Tutorial components include:
- Literature review
 - Book review
 - Movie review
 - Group project activity
 - Research cum presentation
 - Creative writing or paper writing
 - Group discussion
 - Problem-solving exercises
 - Creative production
 - Innovative project
 - Other subject-related scholastic work

40 marks are allocated for Continuous Assessment of tutorials. Out of 40 marks, 5 marks are allocated for attendance as follows:

- (a) More than 67% attendance but less than 70% attendance – 1 mark
- (b) More than 70% attendance but less than 75% attendance – 2 marks
- (c) More than 75% attendance but less than 80% attendance – 3 marks
- (d) More than 80% attendance but less than 85% attendance – 4 marks
- (e) More than 85% attendance – 5 marks

Internal Assessment (IA)

IA consists of class tests, assignments/presentations, and attendance. Example breakdown:

- For IA of 25 marks: 10 (Tests) + 10 (Assignments/Presentations) + 5 (Attendance)
- For IA of 30 marks: 12 (Tests) + 12 (Assignments/Presentations) + 6 (Attendance)

Attendance marks out of 6 are as follows:

- (a) More than 67% attendance but less than 70% attendance – 1.2 mark
- (b) More than 70% attendance but less than 75% attendance – 2.4 marks

- (c) More than 75% attendance but less than 80% attendance – 3.6 marks
- (d) More than 80% attendance but less than 85% attendance – 4.8 marks
- (e) More than 85% attendance – 6.0 marks

Monitoring and Grievance Redressal

Monitoring Committee for IA in each college is responsible for IA and CA processes and grievance redressal. Students dissatisfied with IA/CA may appeal to an appellate body consisting of:
Principal

- Teacher-in-charge/Senior Faculty
- Concerned Teacher
- Nominee of Dean of Colleges/Director, South Delhi Campus (Chair)

Theory and Practical Assessment

Theory and internal assessment include both lectures and tutorial content.

Practical (4 credits): 25% CA + 50% End Term + 25% Viva

Practical (2 credits): 25% CA + 50% End Term (practical/written) + 25% Viva

Grade Improvement and Re-Registration

Students may appear for improvement or re-register as per conditions based on Theory/Practical/IA status.

Improvement rules vary for different combinations of grade satisfaction across components.

Final Marks and Grade Conversion

Final percentage = Grand CGPA × 10

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

1. Students are responsible for their conduct to the Principal and are prohibited from doing anything either inside or outside the college that will amount to a breach of discipline or interference in the discipline and normal working of the college. A student shall be liable to disciplinary action for violation of any of the rules of discipline. Disciplinary action may involve warning and/or suspension from classes, from the examination, from use of the College Library or even from the College as such, or any such action as provided for in Ordinance XV (B), XV(C) and XV (D) of the Rules of Discipline of the University of Delhi.
2. Students shall conduct themselves in a polite manner, both towards the members of the staff (teaching and administrative) and towards their fellow students. Insubordination, unbecoming language or ungentlemanly conduct including teasing etc., shall be severely dealt with.
3. Students shall maintain perfect silence during the class and desist from demonstration of disorderly behavior.





IMPORTANT UNIVERSITY ORDINANCES



ORDINANCE XV-B of the UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

Maintenance of Discipline among Students of the University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such power as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this regard.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - (a) Physical assault or threat to use physical force against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi;
 - (b) Carrying of, use of, or threat to use of any weapon;
 - (c) Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Right Protection Act, 1976;
 - (d) Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the Scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (e) Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women;
 - (f) Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner;
 - (g) Willful destruction of institutional property;
 - (h) Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds;
 - (i) Causing disruption, in any manner, of the of the academic functioning of the university system;
 - (j) Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of discipline as may "seem to him appropriate", the Vice Chancellor may, in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid, order or direct that:
 - (a) any student or students be expelled; or
 - (b) any student or students be, for a stated period, rusticated; or
 - (c) be not for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in a college, department or institution of the University; or
 - (d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or

IMPORTANT UNIVERSITY ORDINANCES (Contd.)



- (e) be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years, or
 - (f) that the result of the student or students concerned, in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. The Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Halls, Deans of the Faculties, Heads of Teaching Departments in the University, the Principal, School of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education and Librarians shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments in the university as may be necessary for the proper conduct of teaching in the institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to, such of the teachers in their colleges, institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.
6. Without prejudice to the power of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented where necessary by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules.
7. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and the several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the Rules. that have been framed there under by the University.

IMPORTANT UNIVERSITY ORDINANCES (Contd.)

ORDINANCE XV-C of the UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

Prohibition of and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
 - (a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) violate the status, dignity and honour of women students;
 - (c) violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribes;
 - (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department of an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostels or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3 (a), (b) and (c), the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student of students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not, for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years, or that the results of the student concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared, be cancelled.

IMPORTANT UNIVERSITY ORDINANCES (Contd.)

11. In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance, appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.



IMPORTANT UNIVERSITY ORDINANCES (Contd.)

ORDINANCE XV-D of the UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at work place and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental thereto.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment.

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention and the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace.

SMT. INDU PUNJ GIRLS' HOSTEL HINDU COLLEGE

With an illustrious history spanning about 125 years, the College attracts highly talented students for its Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate programmes. Taking note of the need for a residential facility for female students of Hindu College, a four storeyed structure was constructed in the College campus. The student residence for the Girls of the College, which became fully functional from the Academic session 2017-18, was formally inaugurated by Mr. Hardeep Singh Puri, the minister of state for Housing and Urban Affairs. We are proud to have a body of girl students who are whole heartedly devoted to the value of excellence as its residents. All the residential rooms are air-conditioned. Round-the-clock security is provided with security guards at the main gates of the hostel. There are CCTV cameras to ensure the safety of the residents at all times. The Hostel has a common room on the Ground Floor where residents can read daily newspapers and magazines, and play indoor games. Television with cable facilities is also provided. The Hostel has a badminton court and an open air space for other recreational activities. Other amenities include a spacious kitchen with modern facilities, a common dining hall, a medical room and common rooms on each floor, which are being used as reading rooms and conference rooms by the students. Each floor has been provided with a well-equipped Pantry for off time self-preparation of snacks/refreshments. There are water coolers on every floor. The Laundry rooms on each floor are fitted with fully automatic washing machines and the Laundry stands. A round-the-clock Lift service ensures the smooth movement of the





students on different floors.

In keeping with the commitment to the environmental issues, a Solar Water heating system has been installed on the rooftop of the Hostel. Great care is being taken to keep the entire place neat and tidy.

The Hostel offers fee waiver for its PwD residents. For students coming from different states and diverse backgrounds, the Student Residence for Girls is thus a very comfortable space- 'A Home away from Home'.

HINDU COLLEGE LIBRARY



LIBRARY

Hindu College Library is one of the oldest among Delhi University College Libraries. It came into existence along with the foundation of the college in 1899. Hindu College Library is fully Air conditioned and computerized. The library is open to bonafide students of all the classes.

There is a well-equipped Reading Room, which subscribes to a large number of dailies, weeklies, periodicals/journals and magazine on a variety of subjects.

Two new floors, each approximately 895 sq meters, are ready. Both the floors are air-conditioned, have separate male, female, and accessible washrooms, CCTV surveillance and fire safety systems are installed, and a passenger lift is also functional.

The newly constructed second floor is now open as a Reserve Section for users. All important textbooks are kept in the Reserve Section to enable the students to write their tutorials, assignments. It has a seating capacity for 125 students and a book stack area.

The third floor is dedicated to S N P Punj Memorial Knowledge Centre for e-Learning with 65 computers connected to Wifi to access the available e-resources with a reading area for 100 users, also has an interactive screen and multi-function photocopier machine with having facility of scanning and printing.

OPAC SERVICE

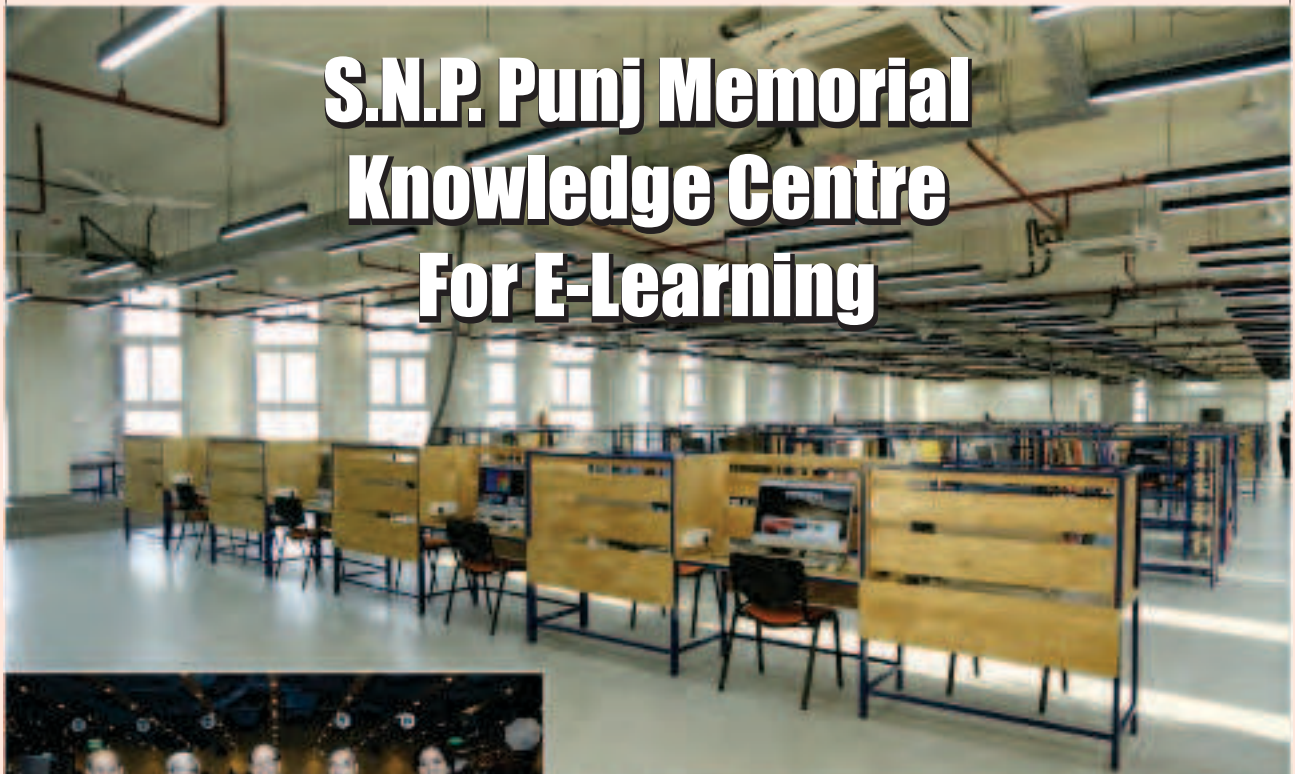

COLLEGE OUTREACH

VIDYA VISTAR SCHEME

Hindu College has partnered with India's three North East Colleges under the University of Delhi's Vidya Vistar Scheme through a tripartite MoU signed on 25.04.2022. The goal of the scheme is to collaborate with higher education institutions located in far off regions of the country. The three colleges are – 1) North Kamrup College, Assam; 2) Nar Bahadur Bhandari College, Sikkim and 3) Dorjee Khandu Government College (DKGC), Tawang, Arunachal Pradesh. Of the three colleges Tawang and North Kamrup are located in the remotest parts of India and in the border areas while Sikkim College is located at a reachable location. In 2024 – 25 a team of three core members of the Vidya Vistar Scheme, Hindu College, Dr. Ananya Barua, Dr. Varunendra Singh Rawat and Professor Archana Verma, paid field visits to all the three colleges and carried the beacon of higher education to the faraway lands through workshops, student interactions and scholarly interplay with the faculty. This is Hindu College's response to two years of bonding and handholding process with our partnering colleges which has enabled each of the partnering institutes to play a role in developing a scholarly network all over India.





PROMOTING SCIENCE AND INNOVATION

INNOVATION COUNCIL

Ministry of Education, Govt. of India has established an 'Innovation cell' with a purpose of systematically fostering the culture of Innovation in all Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) across the country. Hindu College innovation council (HCIC) has been established under Innovation cell in the year 2018. Its primary role is to engage large number of faculty, students and staff in various innovation and entrepreneurship related activities such as ideation, Problem solving, Proof of Concept development, Design Thinking, IPR, project handling and management at Preincubation/Incubation stage, etc., so that innovation and entrepreneurship ecosystem gets established and stabilized in the college. It also organizes Hindu college fortnightly Lecture Series (HFLS), an interactive series which involves national and international speakers on the fields like innovation, entrepreneurship, intellectual property right etc. Latest is the establishment of the Hindu College innovation and startup council (HCISC) whose role is promote start-ups and under startup policy of Hindu college both faculty and students are encouraged to think out of box and venture for startups.





DBT STAR COLLEGE

DBT Star College Scheme

The Star College Scheme was initiated by Department of Biotechnology, Government of India in 2008 to support colleges and universities offering undergraduate education to improve science teaching across the country. This Scheme was launched for improving critical thinking and encouraging 'hands on' experimental science at undergraduate level in basic science subjects. On a larger perspective, the scheme was initiated envisioning that it shall encourage more students to take up higher education in science. Through this scheme the Department identifies colleges with potential for excellence and provides support for developing infrastructure for academics and laboratory activities. This support is in turn expected to invigorate teaching and provide unique exposure of students to experimental science.



Hindu College was awarded the grant under this scheme in the year 2022 with four participating departments namely, Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Zoology. The scheme has not only enhanced the teaching-learning pedagogy for the science courses run under these departments but has also inculcated interdisciplinary collaboration and work culture. The initiatives under this scheme have collectively contributed to a robust academic environment, preparing students for future challenges in their respective fields and beyond.

The College and the respective departments have greatly benefitted from the scheme in more than one ways as mentioned below:

Faculty, Support Staff and Student Development

Under the scheme, faculty members as well as students are encouraged to go beyond the classroom and pursue extension and research opportunities. The scheme supports faculty development through training, orientation, and refresher programs. Regular training and skill enhancement workshops are organized for laboratory and support staff. Additionally, students are involved in various activities such as interdisciplinary projects, workshops, and outreach programs, enhancing their research capabilities and promoting a collaborative learning environment.

Skill Enhancement

The college has established skill units focusing on areas like drosophila research and mushroom - culture. These units offer workshops and training programs for students, faculty, and non-teaching staff, contributing to skill development and fostering a culture of continuous learning.



Outreach

Outreach programs organized under the scheme aim to popularize science among school children, inspiring the next generation of scientists. Moreover, the College tries to identify less privileged schools and localities for conducting awareness programs and drives for societal benefit.

Interdisciplinary Collaboration

The DBT Star College Scheme has promoted interdisciplinary collaboration among departments such as Botany, Chemistry, Physics, and Zoology. Faculty members from these departments coordinate various activities, including hands-on training, seminars, and educational trips, providing students with a holistic understanding of scientific concepts and encouraging innovative thinking.

Infrastructure and Facilities

The DBT Star College Scheme has facilitated increased capabilities of core instrumentation resources by procuring new equipment and upgrading existing facilities. These facilities provide students with the opportunity to engage in both routine experiments and advanced research projects, fostering critical thinking and analytical skills.

DBT Star College Scheme has strengthened the academic and physical infrastructure of the College for achieving excellence in teaching and training.





OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMMES



The Office of International Projects (OIP) at Hindu College facilitates global exposure for students by collaborating with international universities, organizing exchange programs, and hosting cross-cultural events. It aims to build a vibrant platform for academic and cultural exchange. The students elect the Prime Minister from amongst themselves at the beginning of the year. There is also a Leader of the Opposition. The Speaker of the Parliament is a teacher nominated by the Principal in his/her capacity as the President of the Hindu College Republic. The College Parliament is a forum for discussions on academic and other issues. It is an excellent training ground for public speaking and leadership qualities. It allocates funds to the various societies.

SPORTS

The College has a large ground, available for various sports activities. In addition the College has an excellent Sports Complex that houses a state-of-the-art Gymnasium extensively used by students, teachers and non-teaching staff.

Through a variety of outreach and developmental activities, the unit empowers students to become responsible citizens with a strong civic sense.

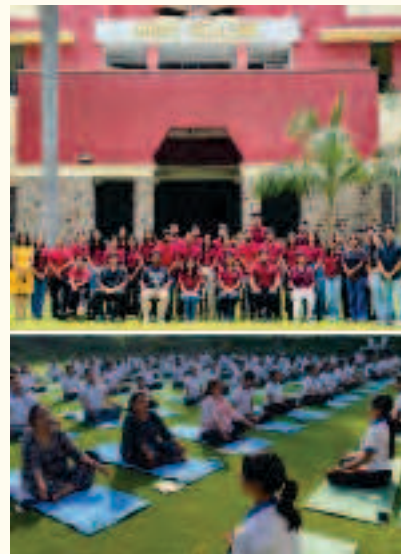
Volunteers are regularly engaged in initiatives such as awareness campaigns, cleanliness drives, teaching programs in underserved areas, and sustainability projects.

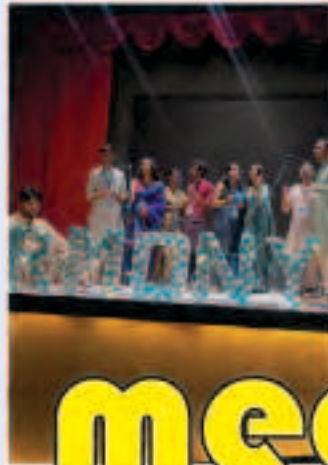

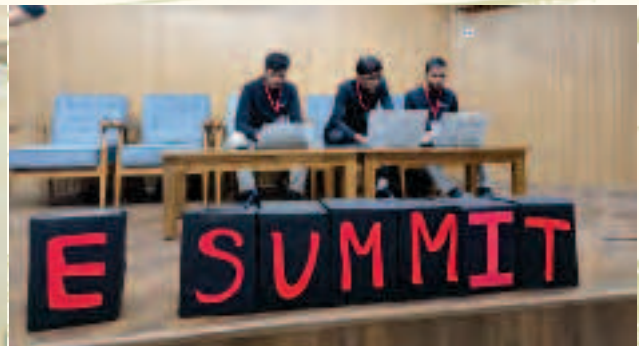


THE ENTREPRENEURSHIP CELL HINDU COLLEGE

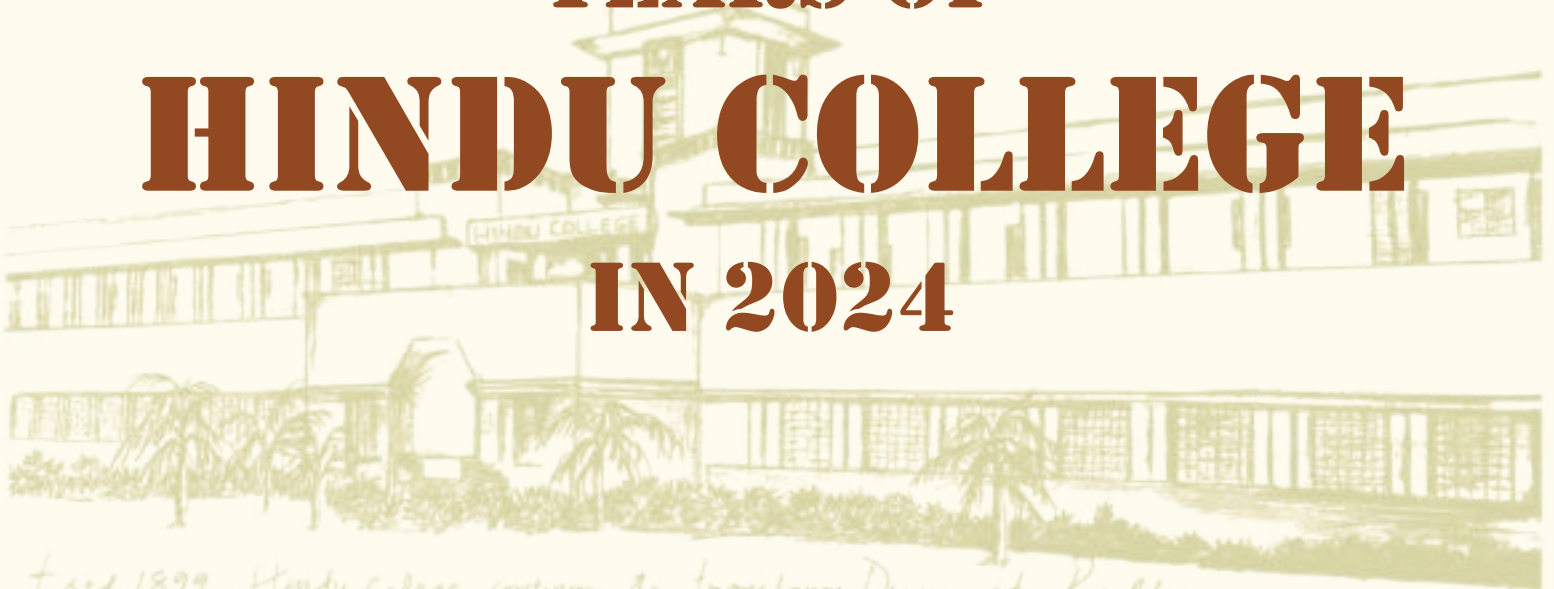

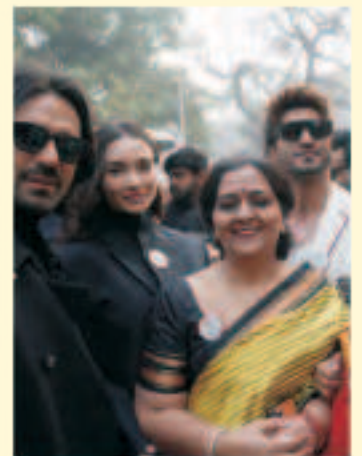
