Thereafter, all the members were apprised about the MoU signed between Hindu College, University of Delhi and Maharani Lakshmi Bai College, Hissar. IQAC director mentioned that in furtherance of MoU signed, the college feels proud to herald the success of the project 'Yeh

Aam Khaas Hai'. This project has been conceptualised with the aim of improving the ecology and environment of the region. The project will also aid in the upliftment of the agricultural community of the area and improve living standards by making available opportunities for additional income for poor and marginalised farmers. Under this scheme, the College has set up a nursery for mango plantations by collecting seeds from the college community and growing saplings for distribution. Additionally, in the initial stages of the scheme, the college will also purchase 200 mango plants and distribute them among the farmers. This will give a kickstart to the project. Apart from benefiting the farmers of the region, this project is also aimed at inculcating community-centric values among students, generating empathy and awareness with regard to the needs of the less privileged, and participating in their development..

In this meeting, subsequently the progress of the AQAR 2021-22 submission and the subsequent allocation of duties for the SSR Cycle II was also discussed. Particularly, the various metrics were distributed amongst the IQAC core team and deadlines were also announced. The work would be finally reviewed by principal, IQAC director and vice principal before submission.

Furthermore, annual plan of action for 2022-2023 was also discussed related to the upcoming endeavours.
