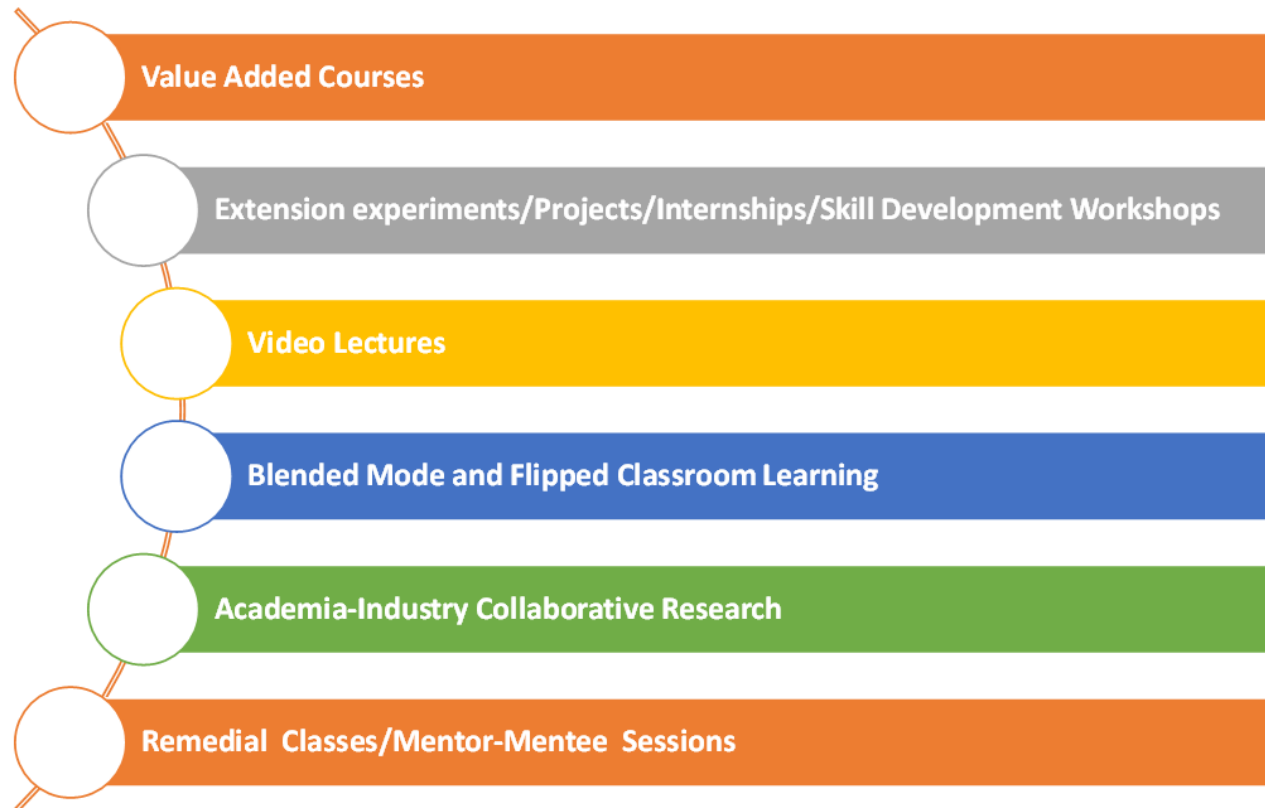

SAMPLE PROOF

ENTHALPY OF NEUTRALIZATION

Aim: To determine the enthalpy of neutralization of ethanoic acid with ammonium hydroxide using Hess' Law.

Introduction:

Heat involved during neutralization of an acid with alkali. The neutralization reaction of strong acid with strong base is essentially the combination of one equivalent of H^+ ion with one equivalent OH^- .

Enthalpy of neutralization is heat evolved when one gram equivalent of acid is completely neutralized by a base in dilute solution.

The chemical reaction is given below:



Where, 13.67 kcal released is the heat of neutralization for all strong acid and strong base.

Enthalpy of neutralization: When aqueous solution of acids and bases react, heat is evolved. This heat change accompanying a neutralization is termed as the heat of neutralization and is defined as the amount of heat evolved when one gram equivalent of an acid is neutralized by one gram-equivalent of a strong base, both being taken as dilute aqueous solutions.



Hess' law: According to this law, "The heat absorbed or released in a given chemical equation is the same whether the process occur in one step or a several steps.


SAMPLE PROOF

Polyunsaturated fatty acid: Fatty acids that possess two or more than two C-C double bonds are mono-unsaturated.
eg:- Linoleic acid

ACID VALUE:- It is defined as the number of milligrams of KOH required to neutralise the present free fatty acid in one gram of any oil.
Lesser the acid value, better is the oil.

Procedure:-

2g of given oil in a conical flask was taken. 25 ml of ethyl alcohol and two drops of phenolphthalein indicator was added to the conical flask. The contents were heated using water bath to dissolve the oil & then titrated against standardized KOH solution from burette drop wise. Same procedure is repeated till a light permanent pink colour is obtained for at 20-30 seconds. The calculation was done and value of given oil is

CHEMICALS REQUIRED: Nutrient agar (7 grams in 250 ml distilled water),
Distilled water , alcohol.

APPARATUS REQUIRED: Heater, conical flasks,magnetic stirrer,weighing
balance, spatula, sterilised petri-dish, measuring
cylinder, Autoclave.

THEORY:

Nutrient agar is used for the cultivation of a wide variety of microorganisms. The medium is also used to subculture organisms for maintenance purposes or to check the purity of subcultures and for isolation of bacteria from water , wastewater, urine faeces and other materials.

Why is insurance important for financial planning?


It is said that change is the only constant in life. With unexpected events occurring all around, often having far-reaching implications, an unfortunate accident can ruin financial and life plans. One may need to dive into savings or the family's hard-earned money. **To guard savings and protect loved ones from the financial uncertainties of life, people opt for insurance.**

Insurance is crucial to providing financial protection to the insured and his dependents. For example – In case of the untimely demise of the bread earner of the family, Life insurance helps replace the income lost. The funds allow our loved ones to maintain a reasonable standard of living. In case a person is diagnosed with an acute ailment and requires expensive medical care, health insurance coverage helps in financially supporting the treatment.

What is Insurance?

An insurance policy is a contract between the insurance buyer (the insured) and an insurance company (the insurer) under which the insurance company agrees to reimburse any losses suffered covered by the policy. A small fee known as the insurance premium is required to be paid periodically in return. It is like a transfer of risk of loss to the insurance company.
